Summarizes the important symmetry features of nuclear systems, discusses independent-particle motion and single-particle configurations. Includes appendixes for readers lacking experience in advanced quantum mechanics.

THE PSYCHOLOGICAL IMPACT OF SCHOOL EXPERIENCE: A Comparative Study of Nine-Year-Old Children in Contrasting Schools— Patricia Minuchin and others—Basic Bks.. 1969, 521 p., \$12.50. Reports the result of a research project designed to find out how different kinds of education—from traditional to the most mod-ern—affect the learning and development of children. children.

SCIENCE AND TECHNOLOGY IN DEVELOPING COUNTRIES—Claire Nader and A. B. Zahlan, Eds.—Cambridge Univ. Press, 1969, 588 p., diagrams, \$16. Proceedings of an international conference held at American University of Beirut, 1967, concerned with the problems of planning the development and application of modern science and technology to the Arab Middle East and Turkey. science and and Turkey.

SCIENTIFIC THOUGHT 1900-1960: A Selective Survey—R. Harre, Ed.—Oxford Univ. Press, 1969, 277 p., plates, diagrams, \$9. Collection of essays, beginning with logic, continuing with physics, chemistry, biochemistry, molecular biology, to ecological genetics, cell biophysics and ethology.

SEX, MAN AND SOCIETY—Ashley Montagu—Putnam, 1969, 287 p., \$6.95. Anthropologist's analysis of sexual customs and practices, ranging from the significance of primitive rituals, through an evaluation of the Kinsey Reports, to reasons for the "natural superiority of women," and a discussion of the contemporary revolution in attitudes toward sex.

TO SAVE THE PHENOMENA: An Essay on the Idea of Physical Theory from Plato to Galileo—Pierre Duhem, transl, from French, introd. by Stanley L. Jaki—Univ. of Chicago Press, 1969, 120 p., \$7.50. New translation of a work first published in Paris in 1908.

THE TRIUMPH OF THE DARWINIAN METHOD—Michael T. Ghiselin—Univ. of Calif. Press, 1969, 287 p., \$7.50. Scholarly essays analyze the significance of Darwin's accomplishment, not only in the light of con'emporary science, but also in relation to modern analytical philosophy.

WORDS IN SHEEP'S CLOTHING—Mario Pei—Hawthorn Bks., 1969, 248 p., \$6.95. Essays deal with so-called weasel words, some newly coined or combinations of words, but more often words used with deliberately changed meaning intended to subtly mislead and call forth an emotional response without thought.

THE WORLD FOOD PROBLEM: A Guardedly Optimistic View—Willard W. Cochrane—Crowell, 1969, 331 p., tables. \$7.95. Presents the political social and economic factors that have created the food problem, then outlines a practical program of policies for both the developed and the developing countries, to create the conditions for a sound development strategy.

WORLDWIDE DIRECTORY OF MINERAL INDUSTRIES, EDUCATION AND RESEARCH—Herbert Wohlbier and others, Eds.—Gulf Pub. Co., 1969, 451 p., \$35. Arranged by countries, helps identify individuals and groups working in specific research areas and describes activities and research projects.
