ANNUAL REVIEW OF MATERIALS SCIENCE, Vol. 1—Robert A. Huggins, Richard H. Bube and Richard W. Roberts, Eds.—Annual Reviews, 1971, 420 p., illus., \$10. Topics range from structural characterization of materials by use of electron microscopy, through solid state phase transformations, to solid thin films, and corrosion science.

ANNUAL SUMMARY OF INFORMATION ON NATURAL DISASTERS, 1969—Unesco—UNIPUB, N.Y., 1971, 73 p., tables, maps, paper, \$2.50. Worldwide record of earthquakes, tsunamis, storm surges and volcanic eruptions, with regional tables and notes.

THE AUSTRALIAN GREAT BARRIER REEF IN COLOUR—K. Gillett—Tuttle, 1971, 112 p., 66 color plates and photographs by author, maps, \$6.75. Describes and depicts in full color the natural beauty of the largest coral formation in the world with close-ups of the fauna that proliferates along the reef.

THE CURIOUS NATURALIST ENGAGE-MENT CALENDAR 1972: An Ecology Workbook—Colonial Publishing, 1971, 110 p., photographs, drawings, spiral-bound, \$2.50. Calendar notebook filled with nature lore and suggestions inviting young and old to observe the changing seasons in nature.

THE ECOLOGICAL CONSCIENCE: Valrest for Survival—Robert Disch, Ed.—Prentice-Hall, 1971, 206 p., paper, \$2.45.
Collection of articles by experts addressing themselves to the complexity of measures necessary for the maintenance of an ecologically sound biosphere.

FAST REACTIONS—David N. Hague—Wiley-Interscience, 1971, 159 p., illus., \$8.50. Discusses the use of molecular beams and diffusion-controlled reactions, and presents an outline of experimental methods; deals with reactions of protons, electrons and metal ions, and with rapid reactions in biological systems.

GRAVITY AND THE ORGANISM—Solon A. Gordon and Melvin J. Cohen, Eds.— Univ. of Chicago Press, 1971, 474 p., illus., \$14. Authoritative and comprehensive survey of the effects of gravitation on the properties and behavior of living matter. Topics range from gravity receptors in plants, and invertebrate and vertebrate responses to gravity, to zero gravity studies.

THE GREAT AMERICAN FOREST—Rutherford Platt—Prentice-Hall, 1971, 271 p., photographs, woodcuts, maps, paper, \$2.95. Reprint of 1965 work, concerned with the various aspects of woods and timberland still covering one third of the continental United States United States.

IN THE SHADOW OF MAN—Jane van Lawick-Goodall—Houghton, 1971, 297 p., color plates, photographs by Hugo van Lawick, drawings, \$10. Generously illustrated account of close observations among wild chimpanzees in Tanzania, gives rare insight into the social organization and behavior of individuals in a chimpanzee community.

INTERNATIONAL ACTION: A Global Survey—Thomas W. Wilson, Jr.—Dunellen, 1971, 364 p., \$12.50. Puts the environment issue in the context of Federal government reactions, summarizes international organizational activities, includ-ing U.N. programs, and presents case studies of selected sectors of action.
