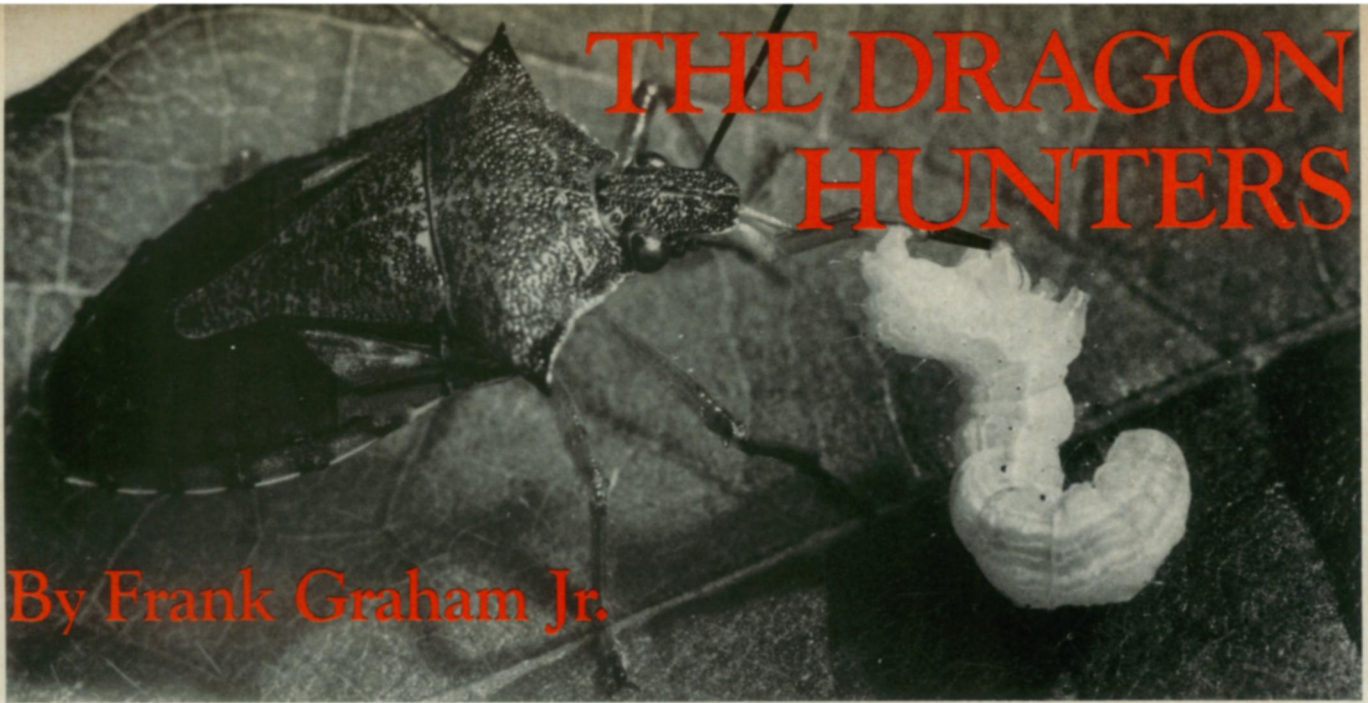

# THE DRAGON HUNTERS

By Frank Graham Jr.

Frank Graham, a field editor of *Audubon*, narrates tales of environmental scientists—for the most part, entomologists who are or have been engaged in controlling insects and other pests through biological means. His book is thoroughly fascinating and very well written. He has done his homework. In putting his stories together, Graham interviewed a considerable number of scientists currently engaged in biocontrol research and read extensively the work of others. His artful use of quotes creates the illusion that the scientists are telling their own stories. From the first chapter, the reader is led gently from insect to insect and problem to problem, without the haze of scientific jargon so common in books of this type. Graham weaves his tales in sufficient detail to satisfy the scientist, but not to such an extent that they overwhelm the layman.
